February is kind of an in-between time. We are between Christmas and the start of the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday will be Feb. 17 with a 7:00 p.m. service. On Sunday, Feb. 14 we will undecorate the church after the worship service and I hope to provide pizza for those who can stay and help. What happens after that day is that the church looks kind of plain until spring and Easter brings a spring time look to the church. We usually leave it rather plain due to the nature of Lent. Lent is a time of introspection, looking at what we need to keep with our spiritual format and what do we need to change in order to have a closer walk with Jesus.

Years ago I was part of a United Methodist ministerial group who held Wednesday night services during Lent. We would travel to each other's churches which meant were only in our home church Ash Wednesday and in each other's churches the other Wednesdays. It worked out quite well as I looked forward to presenting my Lenten service in each church which meant I only had to do one preparation. It was a chance for my church to have other prechers during Lent. I remember one year I prepared a reader's dialogue with three other members of my church. Being a readers dialogue we did not memorize the parts but were readers of the parts. It actually turned out quite well and it was good fellowship for the four of us to travel to the different churches, some of which we had never been in. On any given year I took at least one person with me to be a part of the service.

As the years went by, Lenten services were becoming less attended due to a lot of different conflicts with work, home, and even school. Because Minnesota is great at having snowy days and sometimes weeks, there would be the need to make up sports games with Wednesday being the solution to the conflict.

Nowadays very few churches carry on Lenten services in the United Methodist Church. I think that was a loss for our spiritual journey. So, the Sunday services during Lent are extremely important preparation time. The scriptures that lead up to Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday give us a better understanding of Jesus' whole ministry and what He was trying so hard to impart to us so our lives would become free to live a closer life with Him.

So, our journey will begin Wednesday, February 17 at 7:00 p.m. We will endeavor to journey the road Jesus took to the cross. In some ways I wish we didn't know about the resurrection until Easter Sunday because we might be tempted to just skip to the end of the story. What is important is the journey and what took Jesus to the cross. Then the resurrection and the rest of the story fits into our lives and our journey. God bless us on our journey!





Max examines the gifts that Christ gave us. Gifts when going to the cross, the gifts of grace, the gift of forgiveness, the gifts of love and victory as he chose to be one of us.
